## 8. TEACHING

### (a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments*

I co-developed two new graduate level courses in the School of Population and Public Health:

**SPPH 555 DL Principles and Practices of Injury Prevention.** Graduate-level course offered in Distributed Learning format. The core lectures are based on the Canadian Injury Prevention Curriculum, which I originally developed in collaboration with injury prevention researchers and practitioners across the country. The core curriculum is offered to the students on-line. During the in-person sessions, we focus on expanding ideas, discussing the latest research and real-world examples.

**SPPH 581L DL Determinants of Child Health & Development.** I am the Course Director (with Dr. Shazhan Amed) for a course in the School of Population and Public Health. This course introduces the foundational thinking of what shapes child health and the determinants of child health from molecules to society. Over the term students develop a fictional family profile and experience the determinants of health through this family's experiences. The course culminates with development of a policy brief describing a policy that would meaningfully impact the family.

I approach teaching as life-long learning, continually striving to hone my instructional skills and learn from the students I teach. I have taken several teaching workshops, including UBC's Centre for Teaching, Learning and Technology's intensive 3-day Faculty Instructional Skills Workshop, as well as achieving certification as a Master Trainer for the Canadian Injury Prevention and Control Curriculum. I also seek feedback from students over and above standard evaluations for their suggestions for course improvement. My teaching evaluations, at 4.6 to 5/5, consistently surpass the mean (4.24/5).

I supervise students in my lab via regularly scheduled lab meetings, as well as individual progress meetings twice per month. Students complete a progress report form describing their short-term and long-term goals, their progress since our last meeting and any roadblocks or challenges they are experiencing. Their report forms provide the basis for our discussion, ensure that any difficulties or challenges are dealt with promptly, and act as a record of their accomplishments over time. Students under my supervision have attained 11 university, provincial and national awards, and 3 PI research grants. My postdoctoral fellow has advanced to a faculty position at UBC Okanagan.

**9. SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES**

(a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments*

I am promoting the importance of risk taking opportunities for healthy child development, in contrast to injury prevention’s typical approach that seeks to minimize risk. I have studied about the detrimental effects of this approach on children’s ability to develop risk management skills (publications # 17, 31, 39, 40, 41, 43). I have investigated this issue from two perspectives:

- **Fathering:** The bulk of injury prevention research focuses on mothers or studies parents without considering fathers’ unique approaches and perspectives. My work has shown that injury prevention messaging tends to target mothers and has very little resonance with fathers. I studied fathers’ comparatively greater focus on playing and risk taking with their children compared to mothers, developed theory (publication #15), and recommendations for child health and development (publications #18, 20, 23, 32, 34, 37), as well as methodological approaches (publication #45). Total PI funds leveraged = \$476,654.
- **Risky play:** I have established national and international collaborating with multi-disciplinary researchers and practitioners to promote children’s access to risky play. Working with UBC professor and landscape architect, Susan Herrington, we conducted an intervention study to promote nature-based risky play in two childcare centres in low-income neighbourhoods, as well as a survey examining adults’ remembered play (manuscripts under review). Working with a national consortium, we conducted two systematic reviews (publications #39 & 40) that formed the basis for a Position Statement on Outdoor Active Play (publication #41). This was released as part of ParticipACTION’s 2015 Report Card on Physical Activity for Children. Most recently, I was funded by CIHR to develop an index of playability that would identify features of the built environment that help promote children’s outdoor risky play. Total PI funds leveraged = \$928,711.

In addition to traditional knowledge translation activities (e.g., academic publications, presentations, etc.), I have regularly appeared in the media speaking about my research. In 2015 alone, I conducted 60 interviews with media from 13 different countries. Interest in my work led to 29 invited presentations and numerous workshops with broad audiences (e.g., parents, educators, municipal staff) across Canada.

## 11. SERVICE TO THE HEALTH PROFESSIONS/HEALTH AUTHORITIES

(a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments*

As Associate Director and subsequently Academic Scientist of the BC Injury Research and Prevention Unit, I provide consultation and guidance to health care practitioners and policy makers with respect to child injury prevention and Aboriginal injury prevention. This has included sitting on several committees and reviewing position documents produced by government staff.

Since 2007, I have also been the Director of the BC-site of the Canadian Hospitals Injury Reporting and Prevention Program (CHIRPP). This is a Public Health Agency of Canada injury surveillance system implemented in 17 pediatric and general hospitals across the country. The only BC site is at BC Children's Hospital. This system provides essential data for identifying trends and patterns in child injury locally and across Canada. The data have been used in several national and provincial epidemiological reports, student research projects (e.g., Publication #27), and countless media reports.

I co-authored two best practice documents that are widely used as guides for child safety in Europe (<http://www.childsafetyeurope.org/publications/goodpracticeguide/>) and Canada

(<http://www.parachutecanada.org/downloads/research/reports/ChildSafetyGoodPracticeGuide-CanadianEdition.pdf>). The European guide has been translated into Hebrew, Spanish and Welsh. The Canadian guide is available in French and English and was downloaded over 3,000 times in the first year it was available.

As a member of the Canadian Collaborative Centres on Injury Prevention and Control, I worked with our national partners to produce the Canadian Injury Prevention Curriculum (CIPC). The CIPC standardizes and certifies training for trainees, researchers, practitioners and policy makers interested in injury prevention in an easy-to-deliver workshop package. CIPC has been rolled out nationally and has also been modified as an online course, as well as curricula for several universities across the country, including UBC, where I teach it within SPPH 555DL.

- I undertook complex dyadic analyses of qualitative data to describe couples' negotiations around what they considered to be reasonable risk for their children and necessary safety measures. There was almost universal disagreement between mothers and fathers, privileging men's perspectives. This research has formed the basis of my new partnership with Preventable.ca to develop injury prevention social marketing targeted at parents.

- This systematic review represents a very important advancement for research and practice related to risky play.
